5th anniversary of the death of John Paul II - April 16

We would like to invite everyone to participate in the evening of prayer and reflection on Friday, April 16 at 6:30 pm at St. Jude hall by St. John's church. This will be the beginning of a series of gatherings during which many important issues and questions related to today's Catholic church will be discussed. We will try to to find some answers by reading the Bible, poetry and religious texts (films, books, articles) and discussing the newly explored content. The Bible consists of God's word written by the people inspired by the Holy Spirit.

The prayer will be followed by the presentation of a film based on Karol Wojtyla's play "In front of the Jelewerer's store" directed by Andrzej Maria Marczewski. Meditation over the Sacrament of Matrimony is, in fact, a reflection over the phenomenon of Love. Phenomenon of despair. Bitterness. "On the other side of all of our loves, which are the essence of our life – is Love".

This film is kind of a philosophical study, resulting in deep faith in a human being, in love which is available to all of us, which allows us to overcome loneliness.
